

Student Art Show

The Northeast Regional Honors Council is pleased to announce the return of the student art exhibit for the 2014 conference program in Niagara Falls, N.Y. Student art will be showcased at the Niagara Falls Conference Center on Friday, April 4. Conference attendees and a board of professionals will judge the artwork, and the winners will be announced following banquet.

The theme of the student art exhibit will be: On the Edge.

We are seeking work in various media: oil, watercolor, pastel, photography, mixed media, sculpture, ceramics, glass, wood, fiber, other. We will accept work based on its representation of the theme. Please let your creativity flow when it comes to interpreting the theme for the art exhibit. The reviewers will compile an exhibit that provides broad regional representation of student talent in multiple media forms.

Please note that two-dimensional pieces will be placed on easels and three-dimensional pieces must be freestanding and/or capable of display on a table. Artists may describe multiple pieces in their submittals submissions for consideration. A student artist must be affiliated with an honors program and identify a faculty sponsor to be considered for inclusion in the exhibit (although the work need not be tied to a particular honors course or project). Artists do not need to be present for the exhibit nor in attendance at the conference; however, another conference attendee must accept the responsibility of delivering and retrieving the piece(s) from the exhibit on the artist's behalf.

The deadline for submissions is January 15, 2014, with notification by February 1, 2014.

To make a submission, please send a low-resolution image of your work to nrstudentreps@gmail.com.

Include in the text of the email:

- Your name
- College affiliation and major(s)/ minor(s)
- Your contact information
- Your faculty sponsor and his/her email address
- The name of your honors program director (with email address)
- Title of the piece with a brief description of the work for publication (1-2 sentences)
- The physical dimensions and properties of the work (e.g. 12 x 18 inch, watercolor)
- A short artist statement for the reviewer to better understand you and your work (300 words or less)
